Policy

Feral animals and infant animals may be euthanased or relocated prior to the expiration of the statutory holding period.

Definitions

- a. Companion animal means dog or cat.
- Feral means wild, or existing in a state of nature and showing no signs of domestication. Animals which are wearing a collar, identification tag or microchip must <u>not</u> be deemed feral.
- c. Infant means in the first period of existence and refers to an animal which is not able to feed and fend for themselves.

Procedure

Procedures

- 1. Observe and assess the behaviour of companion animals received at the AHF to determine if they are infant or feral.
- 2. Follow the procedures set out below:
- a. Procedure for companion animals deemed infant
- Receive the animal noting the animal was an infant

Consider the following options prior to euthanasia:

- Is there a rescue association that may take the animal for rearing.
- Is there a compatible lactating animal within the facility that could "adopt" and care for the infant.
- Does the animal appear to be in good health.
- b. Procedure for companion animals deemed feral
- Receive the animal noting that the animal was deemed feral.
- 3. Feral or infant animals may be euthanased prior to the end of any required holding period as determined by the Companion Animals Act 1998.
